The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was signed into law by President George W. Bush in 2003. There is no consent permissible, while a juvenile is detained, for sexual behavior. Lake County Juvenile Detention Center enforces a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY against sexual behavior.
