Comes now, President Repay, opened the meeting for public comment, present to speak for public comment, Barbara Koteles from Hobart, stating, "The other day I saw the list of Boards that you, that the Commission appoints to and it was astounding so thank you for what you do every day, I'd like to get some answers regarding appointments to the Health Board, as you know some Lake County Citizens want to be included on this Health Board and they are qualified for these positions, yet you aren't considering them, why, are you still appointing friends and friends of friends and acquaintances and referrals from current Board Members, it's almost impossible to get information about the Health Board since so much is hidden and not revealed upon request, as you know I have filed almost half a dozen records request through the Commission and only one request was ever answered, does the Commission require a subpoena, why such disrespect for the Law and your constituents, from what I was able to find out through an internet search and from limited information I got awhile ago from Nick Doffin, it appears that two board members had terms that expired at the end of 2023 and you know what when I went to the first meeting of 2024 there they were, at the first, I saw nothing in the meeting agendas from the Commissioners reappointing these members, new Board members are supposed to be appointed at the first meeting of the year which was February 7th, no appointments were made during this meeting that I know of yet a new persons name popped up on the Board member list, what are her qualifications, there's no information on the internet about her or Nick Doffin for that matter and very little information about the other Board members except for Public Health Officer Chandana Vavilala who has a private practice, apparently the Lake County Health Board has it's own set of rules, which aren't allowed to be questioned, how many years have the current Health Board members served on the Board, no one at the Health Board has answered that question yet, they say to ask you, Indiana code 16.22.4 deals with the political composition of the Board, the Board should have seven members not more than four of whom may be from the same political party, this really does need to be checked, I would not be surprised if nearly all of the people on the Board are from the same political party, save one, one Board member actually put down his political affiliation as Independent, that is not a political party, Indiana code 16.25 describes the qualification of the seven Board Members, they can include a registered pharmacist, a dentist, a school superintendent, an environmental scientist, a professional engineer and a veterinarian, is there currently anyone on the Board in these professions, is anybody working on this, is the Commission trying to follow the Law, these appointments should be done in a timely manner and instead it seems that they are ignored, I'm asking you again to please start posting Health Board member vacancies on your website so that some Lake County taxpayers who provided this windfall of five million dollars and who are qualified can have some say so about the Health Department policies and how that money is being directed, thank you.

Comes now, present to speak for public comment, Gerry Scheub from Crown Point, stating, "I was talking to our Northwest Indiana US Attorney couple weeks ago and we discussed thee LED Lights & Fixtures and he had an interesting statement where he said there's good government and there's good contracts, there's bad government and there's bad Contracts, this definitely was a very very bad contract, I don't know if you've had the chance to look at my letter from June 14th, if you have any comments on it, well one suggestion is, let me stay home and pay Production Distribution four hundred and thirty five thousand dollars, which they were entitled to on this Contract and fraud, bid rigging and collusion kept them from getting in on this Contract, lights ended up coming from China while Trump was fighting embargos, yet we were given, Commissioners were given a Contract for Lights from China, so only thing I'm saying is, I want to stay home, but I want Production Distribution paid for what was rightfully theirs, I'm not asking anything for Sweney or Midwest Electric because I still think one of those two should've got the Contract and it shouldn't've gone any further and I wouldn't be here today if it was done right from the start, so any time you want to talk to me I'm available but I will be back every month and I'll probably run and an independent and I will be on WJOB every month and there's more to come. there's a lot more involved in this that nobody knows about and I will be bringing it out, so if I were you gentlemen, I'd get this off the table and let's go on with life because what you did, your Attorney did a great job, Raggs, in trying to exonerate you from any responsibility but the total responsibility in this Contract lies with you three up here, you initiated it, you finalized it and you have to answer for it and until you do, I'm going to be here, so let's get it right and let's pay Production Distribution what's due to them, because you already cost the County over a million dollars and that was less than you would've paying Midwest Electric in the first place, so I started investigating this when people asked me to, back in 2020, you filed a lawsuit against LTN in 2022, I've been with the Prosecutor, the FBI, the NWI Indiana Attorney for two and a half years, for some reason and the press seems to be scared to put this in the paper, but I will be here and if you write a check for them, you won't see me again and you won't see me on the ballot, thank you.
