I am proposing several suggestions to Lake County for the use of the additional CDBG funds (\$886,613) to meet COVID related needs. These suggestions also reflect potential requests by the City if deemed eligible, particularly 1), 2), & 3) noted below.

The City of Hobart, and potentially other communities, could make use of these funds to retrofit our public facilities to create a safer work place for both employees and the public. This could be one or more of the following improvements: 1) reduce unknowing disease spread via physical barriers at public counters, 2) remote communication like drive-up stations with pneumatic tube delivery systems, 3) modifications to HVAC systems with incorporation of UV lighting and/or special filters, and 4) modifications to ingress/egress locations to screen entering public and/or employees.

In addition any program that could assist small businesses in our historic downtown would be most beneficial. Often with older buildings the financial needs are greater for small business operations in terms of building upkeep or renovation. If there were CDBG programs that could assist in the retention of these small businesses whose needs may not be addressed by other programs I would suggest Lake County consider this as well. Also programs might be needed to attract new small businesses to replace

those that may not survive. A vibrant downtown, especially in Hobart, is important to a community's quality of place.

While at present our need for PPE is being met, there may be a point in the future where supplemental funds for these type of purchases will be needed.

Please let me know further details on how the City of Hobart can apply for additional CDBG funds. I appreciate your request for our input.

Please accept this letter on behalf of the Continuum of Care Network NWI, Inc., Region 1-A of the BOS/COC of Indiana, serving the entire Lake County area on behalf of the homeless citizens and those precariously housed. The population we serve are found in the LMI citizenry of our county. The Continuum of Care has membership of approximately 40 plus organizations that provide direct and indirect services to the LMI/homeless/precariously housed individuals and families. Therefore, the Continuum of Care is seeking funding for the reason expressed below.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are now national faced with as well as in our county, the need for a Quarantine/Isolation Shelter (QIS) has now been required to aid in fostering the Shelter-in-place and isolation for those who but for the QIS will be without proper care and housing during this time. The shelter concept is for the homeless who through

Medical professional services/referral:

- (a) Have been tested by a medical professional and are awaiting the COVID-19 test results,
- (b) Been diagnosed and tested positive with the need of shelter but not hospitalization,
- (c) Have been hospitalized with COVID-19 and are ready for discharge, but have not been symptom free for at least 72 hours

Referrals can be made by:

- (a) Emergency Departments and hospitals,
- (b) Outpatient clinics, (i.e. Marram, Methodist Clinics, CHN, North Shore, etc.)
- (c) Public Health Departments within Lake County

The shelter location will be at the Red Roof INN, 8290 Georgia Street, Merrillville, IN. The opening date is being negotiated with details and established criteria as set by the Indiana State Health Department and State-wide FSSA.

"The purpose of this program is to maintain the health and safety of the clients in its care, the staff and volunteers of the program, and society as a whole. This program is established in accordance with Executive Order 20-02, which declares that a public health disaster emergency exists in Indiana attributable to COVID-19 and orders all health care providers to "cooperate with the ISDH in its response to the public health disaster emergency and the implementation of this [EO 20-02]." As such, this program and those carrying out the functions of this program are subject to the immunity granted by various state and federal statutes, including, but not limited to, Indiana Code 10-14-3-15 and Indiana Code 34-30-13.5 et seq."

Again, the request of funds from the CARES ACT stimulates dollars for the Isolation shelter in Lake County would be of great benefit to serve those homeless and precariously housed who are impacted by COVD-19 in this time of crisis. The Funds would be used for the operations/supplies/PPE/food/equipment/transportation needs of the Quarantine/Isolation Shelter.

Mental Health America of Northwest Indiana (MHANWI) respectfully requests funding support through the Lake County Community Economic Develompment Department (LCCEDD) in the amount of \$20,000 for COVID-19 relief for (A) program family emergency financial relief to sustain housing and utilities; and (B) to provide for the purchase of PPE materials for our essential work staff. Costs are detailed below in this request and are submitted humbly and with thanks for the opportunity to request support.

#### **About Mental Health America of Northwest Indiana**

A grateful and longstanding partner of the LCCEDD, Mental Health America of NWI has served the community for over 60 years. We have a unique focus on prevention and early intervention to ensure the health and wellbeing of our community. Our work eliminates the occurrence and impact of abuse, neglect, and other barriers limiting positive mental and physical health.

Much of our programming is dedicated to parent/child support through home visitation (building protective factors in the home). We also serve and advocate for all individuals living with mental illness in our community. Our mission is to transform our communities through proven programs that educate, empower, and strengthen the way families function for life.

Over 90% of the families we serve live at or just above poverty level; and all MHANWI programs and services are offered at NO COST to participating families.

# Request (A) – Program Family Emergency Financial Relief to Sustain Housing & Utilities - \$15,000

Funds requested will be used to provide **emergency financial support** to program families in crisis due to COVID-19 (layoffs, furloughs, and job loss). Many of our families struggle daily to make ends meet under normal circumstances, let alone the added stress and impact of global pandemic. We have built trusting, in-home relationships with each of the families we serve, and are often the first line of support for families during times of crisis. Many families are forced to choose ... "which bill can I pay this month?" putting families in a pattern of financial and emotional distress. To help reduce stressors associated with these constraints, we provide all services at NO COST to participating families, regardless of socioeconomic status; and we work with other community partners to ensure effective referrals to help reduce strain on all families.

With the financial impact of COVID-19, constraints on these families is escalating. We would like to utilize \$15,000 of the full amount requested to set up an **emergency financial relief fund** for our program families in the direct need.



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In managing the distribution of funds to those most in need, we will apply best practices gained as a former Lake Area United Way Hand Up Grant Recipient, which allowed for emergency financial relief for program families in 2019 and was executed flawlessly by our team in support of 22 families in need. MHANWI will follow the same format and protocols put in place for emergency fund management and tracking. Our team successfully distributed grant funds of \$9,500 for emergency relief (eligible for mortgage/rent/utilities). We were able to successfully support 22 households/families during that grant period, expending the full \$9,500 in just 22 days.

To forecast the potential of emergency funding for families at this time, our last breakdown of support was as follows (and would be limited to these areas of support):

- 57% supported rent assistance
- 33% supported utility assistance
- 10% supported mortgage assistance

Our agency serves over 950 families per year. We anticipate that a \$15,000 grant would serve 30 families at an estimated \$500 (cap) support each. While this would support just 3.2% of our program families, we believe ANY relief during this time is a step in the right direction. Assuming an average of 2 children per home (national statistic), with your help, we can make a difference for approximately 60 NWI children and their families.

In partnership, we offer assurance that 100% of funds would be used for families in needs. Administrative costs will be provided in-kind by our team at MHANWI. Funds will be used to bridge short-term needs experienced by MHANWI program families (pregnant and parenting up to 5 years of age). A sample tracking sheet used for our past emergency funding program is attached for reference; this is the document that would be used to track funds distributed. All fund distribution would be managed by our VP Finance, with checks mailed to eligible participants within 7-10 days from time of request (emergency situations would be processed sooner – i.e. threat of eviction).

#### Request (B) – Purchase of PPE Materials for our Essential Work Staff

Mental Health America of Northwest Indiana is identified as an **essential business** under the Indiana State definition **Organizations That Provide Charitable and Social Services** – this designation includes businesses and religious and secular non-profit organizations when providing food, shelter, social services and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals, individuals who need assistance as a result of this emergency, and people with disabilities.

As a result of COVID-19, MHANWI temporarily moved to a virtual service platform on March 16th in compliance with the State's shelter in place mandate and in support of keeping our employees and the families we serve healthy and safe. However, as we watch the State guide and plan for the potential reopening of our economy in the next 30-90 days, we are developing our plan for a physical return to the office (and hundreds of homes throughout Northwest Indiana) in that same timeframe.

As we are all experiencing a "new" normal, MHANWI wants and needs to be prepared with equipment that will protect its employees in the face of health threats now and moving forward. Under usual



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working conditions, 70% of our staff (53 of 77 total employees currently) are in the field each day. Given what we are learning from our experience with COVID-19, including its unknown continued impact, we need to invest now in PPE for our team to use upon its return.

Given availability and lag time in obtaining PPE, our goal is to have supplies on hand when our staff returns so that they may safely, and without hesitation, conduct their essential work. We would like to utilize \$5,000 of the full amount requested to purchase PPE items for our essential workers as estimated below (cost based on current availability/pricing of suitable materials):

- Facemask/Covers (53) 1,000
- Carbon Filters, 4-week supply \$2,000
- Medical Grade Air Purifiers for common work zones (8) \$2,000
