What Can You Do at Home to Be a Good Neighbor?

- Clear away fallen trees, twigs, and debris from natural waterways and stormwater drains.
- Keep swales and adjacent waterways free and clear. DO NOT dump garbage, debris, sticks, logs, leaves, grass clippings, or any other organic material in waterways.
- Prevent gas, oil leaks, and spills. Clean up any spill immediately by absorbing it with a towel, sand, or kitty litter. DO NOT dump oil and motor products in storm drains or inlets.
- DO NOT blow, sweep, or dump grass clippings or leaves into the street, down storm drains and drainage ditches.
- DO NOT create berms or obstructions that would impact a neighbor's drainage or stormwater flow.
- DO NOT position downspouts or drainage directly onto neighbors. Use vegetated areas to absorb or filter stormwater, where possible.
- Compost plant clippings, leaves, excess grass clippings, and other plant material. These can bagged for curbside pickup in cities or towns that provide that service.
- Report any polluters that are dumping or discharging pollutants into the storm drain system by calling MS4 Coordinator at (219) 755-3753 or fill out a complaint form online at www.lakecountyin.org (under Government > Surveyor).
